



2019 Student Scholarship/Summer Internship Program Details

The Coal Association of Canada is pleased to announce the launch of a new combined scholarship/internship program to begin in the summer of 2019.

The intent of the program is to award both a monetary scholarship directly towards post-secondary tuition as well as a paid internship combining practical field experience with an operating coal mining company and research projects for the CAC during the summer of 2019.

This will be an extraordinary opportunity for the successful applicant and provide significant insight into the complex and evolving coal industry in Canada.

Scholarship

A \$5,000 scholarship paid directly to the successful applicant's educational institution towards the following year's tuition.

Internship

The internship will combine both custom field experience at an active metallurgical coal mine(s) site and associated operations along with a research component on various topics related to the coal industry including latest coal technologies (mining and emissions control), coal production, economics and markets. The program will be tailored to the successful applicant's field of study as best possible to provide maximum benefit to both the intern and the Coal Association of Canada.

Internship Logistics:

The internship will run for 8-10 weeks (40 hours per week) in the summer of 2019. Exact dates will be confirmed in early 2019 but will run from approximately mid-May to mid-July. The internship will be based in Tumbler Ridge, British Columbia, where Conuma Coal Resources operates 3 coal mines.

This is a paid internship. Payment will be \$10,000 for the duration of the program, minus all applicable taxes and deductions. The intern will be hired by Conuma Coal Resources and subject to all employment safety standards, policies and requirements of the company.



Accommodation for the duration of the program will be provided, however all other living expenses (food, transportation costs) will be the responsibility of the intern.

The successful applicant is required to provide their own transportation. They will need to travel to/from the Tumbler Ridge area and be able to transport themselves daily to various mines/locations in the Tumbler Ridge area. Must provide own laptop as well.

Applications will be accepted from November 12, 2018 to January 25, 2019. No applications will be accepted after that date.

Interviews of prospective candidates will be conducted in February, 2019. The winner will be selected and notified by early March, 2019.

Student Scholarship/Summer Internship Program Eligibility Criteria

The following are the scholarship/internship criteria. Each applicant MUST be:

1. A full-time student enrolled in a 4-year program at a credited post-secondary institution and graduating in 2020 or 2021 (a second or third year student at time of selection).
2. Pursuing a degree in a mining-related field, such as Mining Engineering, Geology, Environmental Science or similar discipline related to the coal mining industry.
3. Have an expressed interest in the Canadian coal industry as a career path.
4. Must be a Canadian citizen.

Scholarship/Internship selection is managed as follows:

1. The Coal Association of Canada will distribute scholarship/internship information to interested academic institutions. These will include the University of British Columbia, British Columbia Institute of Technology, Simon Fraser University, University of Alberta, University of Calgary, University of Saskatchewan, McGill University, and others.
2. The Coal Association of Canada's Scholarship/Internship Selection Committee, comprised of members of the Association's Board of Directors and President, will review all applications. The top three candidates will be interviewed and one student will be selected as the recipient of the scholarship/internship.

Scholarship/Internship presentation is handled as follows:

The monetary value of the scholarship (\$5,000 CAD), as set annually by the Association's Board of Directors, will be sent directly to the post-secondary institution to be used as tuition credit for the winner.

Applications will be accepted from November 12, 2018 to January 25, 2019. No applications will be accepted after that date. Interviews of prospective candidates will be conducted in February, 2019. The winner will be selected and notified by early March, 2019.
